## General Policies and Expectations

### ADVERTISING

Students, student organizations, or non-CSU individuals, businesses, or organizations may advertise products or events on designated residence hall bulletin boards or at locations for students to pick-up information. Those wishing to display advertisements, other than residents of the hall where the advertising is to occur or Residence Life staff members, must first obtain a permit to do so from the Residence Life Office, Room 111, Palmer Center. Residence Life staff will direct the posting or displaying of the advertisements. Advertising by those other than residents or staff members that has not been permitted or is posted in non-designated areas will be taken down and discarded. Advertising should avoid the use of obscene language and may not promote illegal behavior including the underage use of alcohol or illegal drug use.

### ALCOHOL AND DRUG POLICY

The priority in the residence halls is to provide an environment in which students may study and sleep. Social activities are encouraged and supported but take second priority to the rights of students to live in an atmosphere that supports their academic progress and personal well being. Students are also responsible for the actions and behaviors of their guests as they relate to the use/misuse of alcohol.

**The possession or use of fermented malt beverages, intoxicating liquors, and illegal drugs is not permitted in any of the residence halls.**

### BLOOD BORNE PATHOGENS

Due to the serious nature of blood borne pathogens, students finding blood, vomit, or other bodily fluids in bathrooms, residence hall rooms, or common areas should report it immediately to residence hall staff. Students responsible for these incidents are required to clean the affected location. Staff will provide disinfectant and instructions for safe decontamination of the area.

### BUILDING ACCESS

Do not prop or otherwise obstruct the normal operation of any security door in the residence halls. This includes exterior doors and doors on your residence hall floor or throughout your hall.
