Dear Troy,

On Friday, April 20, 2007, I was made aware of e-mails sent to David Stern, Vice-President for Academic and Student Affairs on April 17, 2007 and to Linda Hanson, President on April 19, 2007. The content of these e-mails is deemed to be threatening and thus an alleged violation of the Hamline University Judicial Code.

If these allegations are true, you would be in violation of Hamline's Judicial Code as defined as:

2. Physical abuse, verbal or written threat, intimidation, harassment, coercion, sexual violence, and any conduct, which threatens or endangers the health or safety of any person.
13. Violation of published university policies, rules, or regulations including residence hall policies.

Due to the serious nature of these alleged violations, you are being placed on an **interim suspension**: Interim suspension means that you are not allowed on any campus property – St. Paul or Minneapolis – and you are not allowed to attend classes as of today's date.

Because of the nature of this incident, you are required to do the following to lift the interim suspension:

Mental Health Evaluation: Before you can be cleared to return to the University, you must have an assessment conducted by a licensed mental health professional. You may choose the professional, but the University reserves the right to stipulate a specialization or certification. Based on the evaluation, the University may require you to commit to a treatment plan as a condition for continued enrollment. You will be responsible for any cost incurred by the evaluation and/or treatment.

Communication of evaluation results: You must sign a release form permitting the mental health professional to disclose the evaluation and treatment recommendations to the Dean of Students (or designee). The mental health professional will be asked to provide his or her written recommendations regarding: a) your readiness to resume or participate in academic activities; and b) any conditions that the University should impose on your involvement within the living and/or learning environment.


Student interview: You must schedule an interview with the Dean of Students (or designee) to review the evaluation results and to determine if you are ready to resume participation in academic activities.

Decision: Based upon the evaluation and interview processes, the Dean of Students (or designee) will make a decision about your readiness to participation in academic activities. The decision will take into account the impact on the community if you return, as well as whether there are sufficient University resources available to support you. You will receive a written notification of the decision. Approval to return may include specific conditions and/or requirements for continued enrollment.

Once the interim suspension is lifted, we will determine if further judicial action is required.

Upon receipt of this letter, I ask that you contact me at 651-523-2421 so that I know you have read and understood the content of this letter. In addition, Patti Klein, Assistant Dean of Students (651-523-2061) and I are fully willing to work with you to resolve this interim suspension and answer any questions or concerns about this matter.
