

I am writing in response to your letter of April 2, 2007 to President William Brody. Your letter appears to be principally a criticism of the Johns Hopkins University Principles for Ensuring Equity, Civility and Respect for All. You have raised many of these issues before. As you know from our previous responses, we respectfully disagree with your characterization of our policies and with your legal analysis and conclusions.

The Principles and other University policies promote important University values including respect for individual differences, freedom of expression, diversity, mutual respect and non-discrimination. We simply do not agree with your conclusion that it is somehow improper for Johns Hopkins University to adopt principles and policies that promote these fundamental goals and values.
