Dear Chloe & Griffin:

Thank you for passing along the information. Below are the answers to your questions I was able to collect.

Prohibition of backpacks. As we discussed you can prohibit backpacks, but you need to make clear backpacks are not allowed in the building (this should include everyone, even your guests). If people choose to leave their bags outside Moore, they do so at their own risk. You should also be advertising this in advance of the event. If a guest shows up with a bag or backpack you should tell them they are not allowed and instruct them to bring the backpack back to their room or car before the event.

Require Dartmouth ID. Does this mean you are changing your event from one open to the public and only people with Dartmouth IDs are allowed inside? You can ask to see a Dartmouth ID as proof they are vaccinated. If your event remains open to the public, you need to have a way of checking that all members of the public have been vaccinated or have a negative covid test 72 hours prior to accessing the building. Again, as previously discussed, you are responsible for ensuring your event complies with the College visitor policy and all COVID expectations.

Check bags and a metal detector. Checking bags implies that bringing bags into the room is optional and would also require a separate room and staffing. Using a metal detector requires space, an enclosed perimeter, staffing, and equipment, and is not an option at this point.

As previously discussed, the College Republicans—and you as its leaders—are responsible for the smooth execution of this event. The College will assist in enforcing College policy, but as hosts you are responsible for the guests you invite to campus—including crowd behavior, violations of College policies, and any associated damage.

As we discussed this morning, the best way to alleviate your concerns is to move this event virtual or limit it to Dartmouth-only. We continue to recommend this course. If information changes or more becomes available, the College reserves the right to change the format of this event to best ensure the safety of our community and compliance with College policy.
