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Dear New UC Davis Student!

Hello and welcome to UC Davis! UC Davis is committed to ensuring that all students are able to achieve their educational goals while being free of harassment and abuse. This commitment includes a requirement that all incoming students complete a mandatory online Violence Intervention & Prevention (VIP) program. The VIP program is made up of five (5) separate modules: Sexual Assault & Consent; Intimate Partner Violence and Stalking; Societal Norms – Attitudes and Beliefs That Normalize Violence; Bystander Intervention; and Campus Policy, Resources & Reporting Options.

As a new student, you may choose to complete all five modules at one time, or individually at separate times (you do have to get through a module in one sitting for it to count); however, it is crucial that you complete the VIP program in its entirety (all five modules) before the **deadline of Friday, November 7<sup>th</sup>, 2014**. Students who choose not to complete the online VIP program by this deadline will have a hold placed on their ability to register for classes the following quarter.

**To access the online VIP program, please do one of the following:**

A. Login to SmartSite, click "More Sites," and look for "Violence Intervention and Prevention (VIP) Program" in the Project Sites area.

B. If you are already logged into SmartSite, you can go directly to VIP by using this link: [http://bitly.com/ucd\\_vip](http://bitly.com/ucd_vip)

**Make sure to click the tab labeled "Instructions" and read the instructions very carefully before beginning the program so that you can obtain credit for completion.** You must enter three (3) key pieces of information: your name, student ID, and your UC Davis assigned email address. You also must reach the last slide that says "Thank You" in order for your completion to be counted and the requirement fulfilled.
