

Minimum sanction: Probation; Maximum sanction: Suspension

1. No student may intentionally or with reckless intent damage, deface or destroy University property or that of any other person;
2. No student may litter or place graffiti on walls, doors, furniture or other property.

G. Disruptive Conduct

Minimum sanction: Warning; Maximum sanction: Suspension

A student will be found responsible for disruptive conduct if they substantially impair, interfere with or obstruct the orderly conduct, process and functions of the University. Disruptive conduct includes, but is not limited to: noise which is unreasonably excessive in the area, time or manner in which it occurs; threatening or obscene language or behavior in public places; obstruction of vehicular traffic; and classroom behavior which materially interferes with either (a) the instructor's ability to conduct the class or (b) the ability of other students to profit from the instructional program.

This policy is not intended to discipline students for classroom dissent or civil discourse. Nor is it intended to hinder organized, nonviolent and orderly protests that are undertaken within reasonable time, manner, and place as established by the University's Expressive Activity Policy.

H. Drug Violations

Minimum sanction: Probation; Maximum sanction: Expulsion

1. The intent of, actual distribution of, sale of or manufacturing of drugs, narcotics, barbiturates, hallucinogens, cannabis/marijuana/hashish, steroids, amphetamines or any other controlled substance is prohibited. This includes any form of sale, exchange or transfer, regardless of monetary transaction.
2. The possession or use of controlled dangerous substances, cannabis/marijuana/hashish, steroids, or narcotics, including, but not limited to, opium (morphine, codeine, heroin), prescription drugs in possession of someone other than the prescribed individual, misuse of prescribed drugs, and every other substance not chemically distinguishable from them (i.e. imitation/synthetic products such as bath salts and/or K2) as well as any drug paraphernalia, on campus or in any property owned, controlled or leased by the University or University-related entity is prohibited.
3. Individuals who are under the influence of cannabis/marijuana/hashish are prohibited from campus and property owned, controlled and rented by the University or a University related entity.

New Jersey has adopted laws to legalize the medicinal use of cannabis/marijuana, and recreational use of cannabis/marijuana and hashish by persons over the age of 21. However, the University is obligated to comply with federal laws – The Controlled Substances Act, 21 USC 801, and the Drug Free Schools and Communities Act, 34 CFR 84 – which prohibit the cultivation, distribution and possession of marijuana. Therefore, the use of cannabis/marijuana prescribed for a medical condition in any form (including edibles, etc.), and the use and/or possession of recreational cannabis/marijuana or hashish by any person at any age, on the University's campus or property of a University related entity, is **prohibited**.

In addition, a conviction in criminal court for certain controlled substance offenses including drug possession and/or sale (including but not limited to marijuana/hashish) may cause a student to be ineligible for Federal financial aid for a period of time. See the Financial Aid Office for details
