[Proposed] FINAL ORDER AND JUDGMENT

CALIFORNIA, for itself and sued as UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, LOS ANGELES (collectively "UCLA") as follows:

- A. On March 2, 2018, Petitioner submitted a request to UCLA for copies of records as set forth on **Exhibit A** (the "Request"). In particular the Request sought:
 - 1. A copy of any video of United States Secretary of the Treasury Steven Mnuchin speaking at the University of California, Los Angeles.
 - 2. A copy of any agreement or contract concerning Sec. Mnuchin's appearance at UCLA.
 - 3. Any communications with Sec. Mnuchin or anyone acting on his behalf concerning the release or non-release of audio or video of Sec. Mnuchin's appearance at UCLA.
- B. The Request reasonably described identifiable records.
- C. Records responsive to Request No. 1 were made available by March 9, 2018.
- D. On April 10, 2019, UCLA made available to Petitioner the records attached as **Exhibit B** in response to Request No. 3 and wrote Petitioner that there were no documents responsive to Request No. 2.
- E. In light of the scope of the requested records sought by Requests Nos. 2 and 3, UCLA failed to make the records responsive to Requests Nos. 2 and 3, to the extent they existed, available promptly within the meaning of California Government Code § 6253(b), and the timing of when the public records were made available to Petitioner objectively resulted in a delay of Petitioner's inspection or copying of those records.
- F. On March 9, 2018, UCLA wrote Petitioner a letter stating in part that "we require additional time to respond to your [March 2, 2018] request, due to the following circumstance(s): [X]¹ The need to search for and collect the requested records from field facilities or other establishments that are separate from the office processing the request." The office processing the request was UCLA's Office of Information Practices, 10920 Wilshire Blvd., Ste 107, Los Angeles, CA 90024. The March 9, 2018 letter stated an estimated extension date of March 26, 2018 by which a determination would be dispatched to Petitioner of whether the request, in whole or in part, sought

copies of disclosable public records in the possession of the UCLA. UCLA's March 9, 2018 letter did respond to Petitioner's Request No. 1, stating: "at this time, pursuant to California Government Code section 6253, we are able to make the requested video available to you. UCLA received consent from the U.S. Treasury Department on March 9, 2018 to post the full video of Secretary Mnuchin's recent presentation at UCLA to the Burkle Center's website. The link to the video is now posted: http://www.international.ucla.edu/burkle/multimedia/189606. This link serves to

complete our production in response to your request for the video of the event."

- G. On March 26, 2018, UCLA sent Petitioner a written determination stating June 29, 2018 as an estimated date when the disclosable records would be made available to Petitioner. UCLA sent four subsequent communications extending the estimated date and time when the disclosable records would be made available, the last of which extended the estimated date when the disclosable records would be made available to April 30, 2019. Copies of those letters and the March 9, 2018 letter written by UCLA are attached as **Exhibit C**.
- Without admitting whether UCLA constitutes a "state or local agency" for purposes of California Government Code § 6253.3, UCLA states that it did not allow another party to control the disclosure of information in response to Petitioner's March 2, 2018 request.
- I. Based on the language of the judgment set forth above, Petitioner reserves its right to seek costs by memorandum and reasonable attorneys' fees pursuant to Government Code § 6259 by noticed motion and the Court may determine whether Petitioner is the prevailing party and entitled to an award of reasonable attorneys' fees and costs. UCLA reserves the right to oppose and seek to tax any costs sought, and to contest the amount and reasonableness of attorneys' fees sought.
- J. The undersigned counsel represent that they have been granted authority by their respective clients to enter into this agreement and execute this stipulation pursuant to the Respondents' Offer of Judgment which is attached hereto as **Exhibit D**.

WHEREFORE, the Judgment set forth in paragraphs A-H above is hereby entered, with

Respondent Regents of The University of California, for itself and erroneously sued as University of California, Los Angeles (collectively "UCLA") offers to have judgment taken against it and for Petitioner on the above-entitled Petition for Writ of Mandate ("Petition") pursuant to Section 998 of the Code of Civil Procedure according to the terms and conditions set forth herein.

On March 2, 2018, Petitioner submitted a request to UCLA for copies of records as set forth on Exhibit A (the "Request"). In particular the Request sought:

- 1. A copy of any video of United States Secretary of the Treasury Steven Mnuchin speaking at the University of California, Los Angeles.
- 2. A copy of any agreement or contract concerning Sec. Mnuchin's appearance at
- 3. Any communications with Sec. Mnuchin or anyone acting on his behalf concerning the release or non-release of audio or video of Sec. Mnuchin's appearance at UCLA.
- 2. UCLA offers to have judgment entered, finding:
- The Request reasonably described identifiable records.
- Records responsive to Request No. 1 were made available by March 9, 2018.
- On about April 10, 2019, UCLA made available to Petitioner the records attached as **Exhibit B** in response to Request No. 3 and wrote Petitioner that there were no documents responsive to Request No. 2.
- UCLA does not agree that the production of records responsive to Request No. 3 resulted from the filing of the Petition. Nor does UCLA agree that the California Public Records Act, Government Code §6250 et seq., permits a claim for undue delay in producing records or that the facts here constitute undue delay. Nonetheless, in the interests of avoiding further litigation and incurring further costs or attorney's fees, UCLA offers to not contest those issues in this case only and offers to have judgment entered as follows:
 - In light of the scope of the requested records sought by Requests Nos. 2 and 3, UCLA failed to make the records responsive to Requests Nos. 2 and 3, to the extent they existed, available promptly within the meaning of California Government Code

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- §6253(b), and the timing of when the public records were made available to Petitioner objectively resulted in a delay of Petitioner's inspection or copying of those records.
- Based on the language of the judgment set forth immediately above, the Court may determine by noticed motion whether Petitioner is the prevailing party in litigation filed pursuant to Government Code §6259 and entitled to an award of reasonable attorney's fees and costs.

In addition, UCLA agrees to stipulate to the following additional facts:

- f. On March 9, 2018, UCLA wrote Petitioner a letter stating in part that "we require additional time to respond to your [March 2, 2018] request, due to the following circumstance(s): [X] The need to search for and collect the requested records from field facilities or other establishments that are separate from the office processing the request." The office processing the request was UCLA's Office of Information Practices, 10920 Wilshire Blvd., Ste 107, Los Angeles, CA 90024. The March 9, 2018 letter stated an estimated extension date of March 26, 2018 by which a determination would be dispatched to Petitioner of whether the request, in whole or in part, sought copies of disclosable public records in the possession of the UCLA. UCLA's March 9, 2018 letter did respond to Petitioner's Request No. 1, stating: "at this time, pursuant to California Government Code section 6253, we are able to make the requested video available to you. UCLA received consent from the U.S. Treasury Department on March 9, 2018 to post the full video of Secretary Mnuchin's recent presentation at UCLA to the Burkle Center's website. The link to the video is now posted: http://www.international.ucla.edu/burkle/multimedia/189606. This link serves to complete our production in response to your request for the video of the event."
- On March 26, 2018, UCLA sent Petitioner a written determination stating June 26, g. 2018 as an estimated date when the disclosable records would be made available to Petitioner. UCLA sent four subsequent communications extending the estimated date and time when the disclosable records would be made available, the last of which extended the estimated date when the disclosable records would be made available to April 30, 2019. Copies of those letters and the March 9, 2018 letter written by UCLA are attached as **Exhibit C**.
