Your letter reflects a serious misunderstanding of Collin College. I would like to share the following:

Collin College serves more than 58,000 credit and continuing education students annually and offers more than 100 degrees and certificates. We enjoy growth year after year – even during this pandemic. We have been highlighted as one of the best higher education employers in the nation, thanks to recognition by The Great Colleges to Work For program, one of the largest and most respected workforce-recognition programs in the country. This is a true honor since it is based on surveys of our own employees. In fact, this year Collin College received special recognition as an Honor Roll institution for the second year in a row, with honors in 10 categories including the following six:

Collaborative Governance
Confidence in Senior Leadership
Job Satisfaction
Professional/Career Development Programs
Respect & Appreciation
Teaching Environment

In November, we were among 30 community colleges nationwide selected as a 2021 finalist for the highly coveted Bellwether Award, widely regarded as one of the nation's most competitive and prestigious recognitions for community colleges.
