Dear President Porter:

FIRE appreciates your response to our recent letters. However, our concerns are not alleviated. Particularly, we remain concerned that Lindenwood University claims student organizations may not endorse political candidates.

To be clear, your own Institutional Non-Partisan Policy allows students and student organizations to engage in core political speech, like endorsing candidates. It makes clear that the "policy is in no way meant to deter students or organizations on campus from engaging in political discussions and debate." But even if LU policy did prohibit such expression, any such limit on free expression would violate LU's clear, contractually binding commitment, by which it is professed that LU "values freedom of expression and the open exchange of ideas and, in particular, values the expression of controversial ideas and differing views."

Additionally, as we explained, only LU itself cannot endorse candidates due to its status as a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization—students and student groups who endorse candidates in their personal capacities, and not on the university's behalf, face no such bar. The practice of students endorsing candidates therefore cannot endanger LU's tax-exempt status, and LU accordingly must allow students to do so under its strong free expression promises.

More to the point, LU must allow the College Republicans—and all other student groups at the university—to include candidate-endorsement clauses in their proposed constitutions, and to endorse candidates for office if they choose to do so. We request a substantive response to this letter no later than close of business on December 6, 2022.
