

What can you do if you are being cyber-bullied?

- If you receive a message that crosses the line (offensive, threatening in nature, harassing, uncivil, e to Campus & Public Safety and a staff member.
- Consider blocking the user who is sending and posting the inappropriate content.
- Print the message and submit a copy to Campus & Public Safety and a staff member. Keep a copy f
- Increase your privacy settings and remove personal information to make it harder for people to se
- Students should be aware that they can be held accountable for posting and sending inappropriat harassing, and threatening content on the Internet (Face book, Twitter, e-mail, IM, texting, You Tu act that is unbecoming of a CU student to include cyber bullying and cyber stalking is considered a the Student Code of Conduct and the CU Student Handbook. Depending he severity of the incide can also be suspended, expelled, and/or arrested for such acts.

What can you do to protect your privacy?

- Never put personal information on Face book and other forms of social media that you do not war people to have (your address, cell phone number, class schedule, residence hall room number, etc.
- Be careful as to who you accept as a "friend" on Face book. Not everyone can truly be a fr know them.



- Be wise in the decisions that you make and the activities that you engage in while you are out havi may seem like fun one day could be posted on the Internet the next day.
- Opt out of special offers. Many on line companies give you the option to leave mailing lists that she personal information. When signing up for a service or offer on line, take a few seconds to "unched to share your information with other companies.
- Always read the fine print. Check the privacy policy of a website before you type information into share it with the company. If the company doesn't have a privacy policy listed, don't share your info
- Check for the lock. Make sure you see a lock in the bottom right corner of your browser before tyle information into a form. This means that the transaction is encrypted—and can't be intercepted.
- Guard your e-mail address. Don't use your personal e-mail address to sign up for newsletters or st Get a free e-mail account just for junk mail.
- Leave personals out of it. When using IM providers and sites like Facebook, remember to set the pastern settings higher to keep cyberstalkers from finding you. Be sure that only close friends and family representation have access to personal information.
