
Dear Mr. Kissel,

Your January 4, 2010 letter directed to President Hart has been forwarded to me for a response. In your letter, you express concern regarding security charges for an event sponsored by Temple University Purpose ("TUP") on October 20, 2009. We share your concern for protecting freedom of expression and assure you that Temple University does not assess fees upon student groups in a manner that is unconstitutional or that otherwise violates the law.

TUP initially was charged \$576 for the event, the standard charge for an event of this type regardless of program content. A charge of \$224 was assessed for the additional security requested by TUP even though the cost of the requested added security amounted to more than \$6,000. Notably, Temple absorbed substantially all of the more than \$6,000 cost for extra security that was requested by TUP. As you know, the \$6,000 could have legally been imposed upon TUP because it was based not upon program content, but upon the request of the student organization. Finally, the event was held in an academic lecture hall and student organizations generally are charged for the use of academic space. However, the university absorbed that cost for TUP as well.

Should TUP find it impossible to pay the \$224 balance out of its Student Activities budget, I would encourage its leadership to speak directly with Jason Levy and the fee will be waived.
