Dear Ms. Bizzell:



Though your actions of verbally reading the unsigned-false allegations in public and later copying and distributing said document were misguided and supported by your belief in your unfettered Constitutional First Amendment Right of free speech, you apparently did not consider that the right to free speech, is not absolute and must be restrained in the context of possible harm to the target of said speech, for instance, you can't yell "Fire" in a crowded theater and claim first amendment privileges. In fact, Ms. Bizzell, no freedoms are absolute, for an individual's freedom only extends to the point that it infringes upon, or harms another.

Therefore, Ms. Bizzell, in that you have indeed breached university conduct in this incident, you are subject to suspension or dismissal

You must move out of housing by 15 November 02, 7 days from the initial infraction.
