Dear Mr. Creeley:

I will attempt to respond to and clarify several issues in regard to your letter of October 1, 2010, but note that many are based in legal arguments more appropriately discussed with counsel.

The original email was sent as a reminder to state employees of state laws which prohibit the use of any State resources in campaign and election activities during election periods. Students were inadvertently included. The limitation did not apply to any email outside of gram.edu and applied solely to the employees, but was not clearly stated.

Grambling State University is a public university within the University of Louisiana System, which is an agency of the State of Louisiana and a public educational system. The email in question is gram.edu which is an internal mail system.

As President at Grambling State University (GSU), I have initiated a comprehensive review of all university policies to ensure that the policies are clear, that they are fair, and that the community understands what is expected of them. The policy on the use of email is one of those policies under review. Once the policies have been reviewed and evaluated internally, they will be reviewed by University of Louisiana System staff and legal counsel to identify any matters that need to be added, removed or clarified.

These policies impact faculty, staff, students and visitors on our campus. GSU has a long history of fostering free expression of ideas within our educational environment as well as speaking up on many issues critical to the university and to the world at large. That is an important role within our university and fostering that environment is critical.

Once the policies have been completed, they will be shared widely with the campus community and all interested parties.
