Sorry for the delayed response. It's been a tough week here with more merger related changes and cutbacks. All of the ups and downs with Roger, Castagna and associated issues has complicated things even further. Once again I made it through the cuts, but we're down from 5 to 3 on the Latin America Exploration Team with one redeployment and one lay-off. The time does not feel right to make a sponsorship request while people are cleaning out their offices.

In a couple weeks, I would suggest Mike Stice is far enough up the command chain to perhaps be able to make a ConocoPhillips sponsorship happen. I have tried to calm these, and told folks I would get back to the AAC ExCom with an update and plan following my time in the field with Roger next week.

Thanks for the heads-up on the membership for Mr. Lockard. I have to admit not giving membership issues much thought yet. I will focus on that in a few weeks when a positive approach for AAC support for Roger is more clear and on track.
